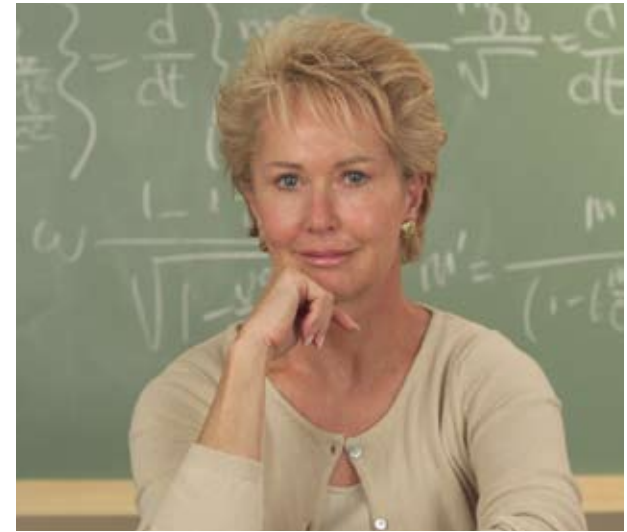


The CTEN Story

The California Teachers Empowerment Network (CTEN) was created by a group of classroom teachers. The idea came about when we realized that we were not getting the kind of balanced information at our school sites that would enable us to make informed decisions affecting our profession. In fact, a wide range of information comes to us from a single viewpoint. It includes global concerns of education policy, leadership, and reform. It also encompasses more personal information, such as professional liability insurance, options of relationships to teachers unions, and the effect of unionism on teacher pay.

The lack of open and informed dialogue on professional matters adversely affects our ability to think for ourselves and inhibits our own use of those same critical thinking skills that we strive to instill in our students. It is very difficult to navigate a complex maze of data with incomplete or biased information. Therefore, the California Teachers Empowerment Network was founded with two profoundly simple goals: to make balanced information available and to provide a peer support network for teachers of like mind who may adopt dissenting views or make decisions that could invite criticism and strained relationships.
